Narrative Description of Indicator

Based on data provided by OSEP on www.ideadata.org, the 24 LITPs provided early intervention services to 1.47% of the M 2009 resident birth to one-year-old population. The percentage of children birth to one year of age receiving early intervention services in Maryland increased from 1.33% in FFY 2008 to 1.47% in FFY 2009. Compared to national data, Maryland provide intervention services to 0.43% more children birth to one year of age than the national baseline of 1.04% and ranked 14th the 50 States and U.S. territories. The resident population of birth to one-year-old children increased statewide by 1,149 FFY 2008 to FFY 2009, a 1.52% increase. From FFY 2008 to FFY 2009, the number of birth to one-year-old children referred to LITPs increased by nearly 2%.

Eleven of the 24 LITPs met the State target for the percentage of birth to one year old children receiving early intervention services. Efforts were made throughout the State to increase public awareness of the program, especially with primary health care providers, in an attempt to increase the number of referrals from both parents and providers. If the State target was met, LITPs were required to develop and implement improvement plan strategies and, as necessary, received technical assistance from MSDE.
