Narrative Description of Indicator

In FFY 2012 (school year 2012 - 2013) the State identified 1032 findings of noncompliance in local school systems and State operated programs. Of these, 1027 were corrected and verified within the required one-year timeline. This resulted in a correction rate of 99.51%. These findings include noncompliance identified through complaint investigations, due process hearings, and monitoring activities. Findings can be systemic, by school, and/or for individual students.

The State's system of general supervision is designed to identify and correct noncompliance in a manner that is consistent with OSEP requirements. Improvements to the State's system of general supervision processes, data collection and use have resulted in an improved rate of the timely correction of noncompliance.

To verify systemic or individual student correction is made, the MSDE uses on-site and/or desk audit methods. The MSDE staff and consultants verify that the noncompliance is corrected using a two prong procedure. First, a review of the records where the noncompliance was first identified are reviewed to determine if correction has occurred, or, the requirement was completed (for timeline violations), unless the child is no longer within the jurisdiction or the parent has withdrawn consent. Then, using updated data an additional review is conducted in a sample of records of other similarly situated students to determine the level of compliance. If both reviews result in 100% compliance, then correction has been achieved and the corrective action is closed.
